The church choir has been practicing music for the Lenten season, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday. If you have ever thought about singing in the choir, now is the time to join us. It's always nice to have extra voices in the choir during a special season. Choir practice is each Sunday morning at 9:00. Our choir members are also busy rehearsing for Brahm's Requiem to be presented Palm Sunday, April 5 at 7:00 p.m. in our church. Along with this, we are working on the music for our community Easter Sunrise Service also to be held at the Perry Christian Church at 6:30 a.m. Easter Sunday, Aril 12th. The Community Choir will sing a rousing acapella piece called "King Jesus Is Arisen!" by Don Besig and "Mary, Mary", a contemporary spiritual type song with a jazz/rock fell by Joseph M. Martin. Community Choir practice is held each Sunday at 2:00.

There will be a Maundy Thursday communion service on April 9. It will be a simple service of meditation and prayer. Plans are being made for the Palm Sunday Service and Easter Sunrise Community Service and regular Easter service.

After a very good Sunday school hour with good — if not great attendance — 90 people entered the worship service at 10:45. But the most wonderful part came at the end of the service when 5 adults pledged their faith to Christ through Christian baptism; Herman McClain, Craig & Barb Cunningham, Connie Murray and Etta Day. Becky McClain transferred her membership to the church at the same time and with these vital families came six or eight energetic children who truly transform the feeling of energy into the services of the church!

Sunday school has also had some very good days recently; our best attendance of late was 45 during the last Sunday of January. The good group of children who have joined our school has made a difference, Jeanie Gay's great class upstairs has been strong, and the class of "younger" adults ("younger" not including the preacher) which meets in the office has also enjoyed steady attendance of a good group.

Tuck-pointing of the Perry Christian Church during the past few weeks plus sealing – cost was \$13,525.00. To cover the cost, \$5,000 was taken out of the Memorial Fund, \$5,000 was borrowed at the bank and the remainder of \$3,525 came out of the church's checking account, leaving between \$6,000 and \$6,500 left in the checking account. There has been a little over \$2,000 donated by caring individuals to be put on the tuck-pointing loan.

TEEN ASSOCIATE DEACONS ELECTED

A change in the constitution of the Perry Christian Church, approved earlier this spring by the congregation, established the position of Teen Associate Deacon. Those holding this office are elected for one year at a time and must be between the ages of 14 and 18 years of age. Matthew Johnson and Dustin Wasson were nominated and elected by the congregation for the new posts, and were installed together with the senior officers of the church on July 28th.

These young men have already participated in service at the communion table and stand ready to help with the other work of the church in which they can be of assistance.

THREE WEDDINGS IN THE CHURCH SANCTUARY

In the evening of April 27, the wedding of Tricia Norman and Ray Snell was conducted in the sanctuary of Perry Christian Church with Dr. Jorgenson officiating. Tricia is the daughter of Buddy and Carol Norman of the Perry Christian Church. The Snell's are making their home in Colorado.

The wedding of Jerrid Woodhurst and Stacy Weeks of Troy, Missouri was celebrated in the church on June 22, again with Pastor Jorgenson officiating.

Nothing brings joy to my heart and fills me with more delight than seeing the youth participating in the church service. Three Reasons to Sing Loudly in Church

Following is an article emailed to me and I decided that I wanted to share this article with the congregation. Arlen

I have been singing since the fifth grade. I've been in audition-only honors choirs, taken voice lessons, sang in musicals, and even toured Ireland and Scotland with my college chorale. And I have a confession. Sometimes, I don't sing in church.

There is just something about singing in church that feels different than singing with a school choir. Hymns are different than choir arrangements. The tune is usually simple enough for a congregation to figure it out without hours of rehearsals and the old-English lyrics are sometimes confusing.

What is a bulwark ("A Mighty Fortress is Our God)? What is a buckler ("For We Are Strangers No More")? Why are we raising our Ebenezer (Come Thy Font of Every Blessing) and are we talking about Ebenezer Scrooge, from Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol"?

These are questions that I have asked myself while singing hymns. After doing some research, I did find out that a bulwark is a wall, a buckler is a shield, and Ebenezer was a rock that Samuel raised in the air saying that God had helped the Israelites defeat the Philistines (1 Samuel 7:12). Still, it is easy to get stuck on the confusing words and whisper to the person next to you, "Hey, what is a bulwark, anyway?" But if we fail to sing in church, we are missing out on a major component of worship.

In a blog post titled, "Why You Need to Sing Loudly in Church," composer Keith Getty writes that singing in church is on the decline (you may have heard of Getty, or at least know of his work. He wrote "In Christ Alone" with his wife, Kristyn). Christians come to church, pray in church and listen in church. And when it comes time to sing, some of us stand there awkwardly, mouthing the words, or busy ourselves getting a tissue out of our purse. What is up with that?

Getty gives three main reasons why we need to stop this nonsense, and sing to our God.

1. We are commanded to sing.

It is right there in the Bible. According to Getty, scripture commands us to sing over 250 times. "It's not a choice. It's not dependent on 'feeling like it,'" he writes.

Here it is in Psalm 100:1-2 (KJV): "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing."

I suddenly feel very guilty. Refusing to sing in church is openly defying scripture. If that doesn't motivate you to start singing praises, I do not know what will.

You will have to read the next newsletter to get the rest of the reasons why you need to sing to our God! Arlen




